

Folk Embroidery of the Tver Region in the State Art Museum at Zagorsk: From the Second Half of the 18th Century to the Beginning of the 20th Century



Zagorsk Museum features a very important collection of 19/20th century embroidery produced by folk artisans from the land of Tver. The materials of the collection attest to an extraordinary richness of ornamentation in the Tver needlework art, whose inimitable originality derived from its deep-rooted local tradition. The complex process of the evolvement of distinctive features of style in Tver embroidery was to a great extent determined by such factors as the physical environment of the area, its historical background and ethnically heterogeneous population. The particular steadfastness of the local traditions was also due to the seclusion of the villages, which were scattered in dense forests, far from trade routes, and hence not involved in the cash economy or appreciably affected by urban culture. They clung to the old-fashioned mode of life with its age-old customs, rites and beliefs surviving from the paganism of the Early Slavs. A number of design motifs which in the past had a certain symbolic significance can be found on many embroidered textiles. Besides zoomorphic, anthropomorphic and floral motifs, especially well represented are early Slavonic beliefs associated with the cult of fertility or the worship of the elements. This book reproduces for the first time a large number of traditional but iconographically rare subjects deriving from the pagan mythology. Unlike the folk arts and crafts of Northern Russia, the embroidery of the Tver region remained for a long time largely unexplored. The extensive collection at Zagorsk has not yet been sufficiently known to research scholars at large, who would no doubt appreciate the factual data collected on the folk embroideresses, customs associated with the use of embroidery in day-to-day life, local names of various types of stitches and patterns, and the inscriptions.
