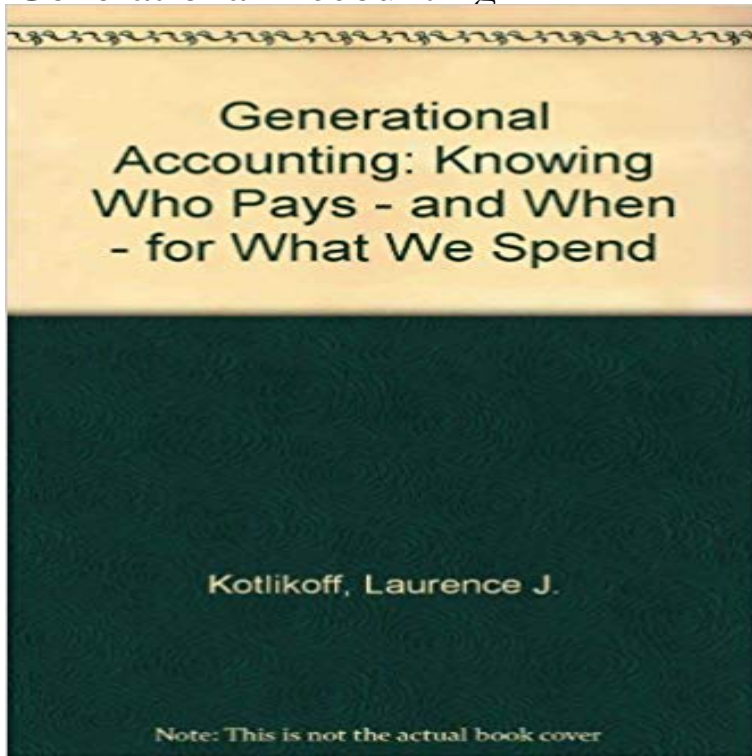


Generational Accounting
